4. Enter your recipient's details : add a new person by entering their details or choose from a list of people you've already sent to.

5. Pay and relax: Choose how you want to pay – bank account or debit/credit card - then confirm the amount.

Mobile money

Send mobile money to your loved ones' phones in an instant

Mobile Money is an electronic wallet service that's available in over 80 countries. It works on smartphones and basic feature phones offering a good alternative to bank accounts.

How? By enabling users to store, send and receive money using their mobile phone. They can buy things in shops or online, pay bills and school fees or top-up mobile airtime – all from their mobile phones

WorldRemit is a global leader in mobile money transactions. With the biggest international network, we make it so easy to send money to any mobile money account.

We send over 180,000 mobile money transfers worldwide every month. But remember, mobile money is just one of four ways of sending with WorldRemit.

Here's how it works

After checking your recipient has a mobile money account, simply use the blue box on this page and then:

- **Select country** you want to send to
- **Select how you want to send**
- **Enter the amount** you want to send – our low fees and exchange rate will be clearly shown

Then, you'll be directed to another page to:

- **Create an account** if you don't have one (you will be asked for your address, email, phone number)
- **Enter your recipient's details** – choose from a list of people you've already sent to, or add a new person by entering their details: name, address and mobile phone number (in most cases this is the money account number)
- **Pay.** Choose how you want to pay – bank account, debit/credit card, SOFORT, INTERAC, POLI or iDEAL (web) – then confirm the amount.

Mobile money usually arrives in your recipient's mobile wallet instantly. Plus, you and your recipient will be alerted by SMS and email when the transaction is complete.

How can family and friends sign up for mobile money?

To see if mobile money is available in the country you want to send to, simply check on the blue box above. Most mobile money services are offered by local mobile telecoms operators and some by banks or other companies.

It's easy to register for a mobile money account. All your recipient needs to do is visit their local mobile money agent and bring a form of identification, such as a valid passport, driver's license or a government ID.

Cash pickup

Send cash for pickup in an instant

If the people you care for thousands of miles away need money, then send them a cash pickup online with WorldRemit. It's so easy – you can do it on your laptop or mobile.

Money can be picked up almost instantly in most countries from numerous cash pickup locations*.

We send over 170,000 cash pickup transfers worldwide every month. But remember, cash pickup is just one of four ways of sending with WorldRemit.

Here's how it works

Simply use the blue box on this page and then:

- **Select country** you want to send to
- **Select how you want to send**
- **Enter the amount** you want to send – our low fees and exchange rate will be clearly shown

Then, you'll be directed to another page to:

- **Create an account** if you don't have one (you will be asked for your address, email, phone number)
- **Enter your recipient's details** – choose from a list of people you've already sent to, or add a new person by entering their details: full name (exactly as it appears on their ID), phone number, address and email (optional)
- **Pay.** Choose how you want to pay – bank account, debit/credit card, SOFORT, INTERAC, POLI or iDEAL (web) – then confirm the amount.

*To see where these locations are in the country you're sending to, simply select that country in the blue box on this page, then and scroll down to cash pickup.

What recipients need to show when collecting funds

- **Identification.** This must be a government issued ID, such as a passport or driving licence.
- **Transaction reference number.** When collecting funds your recipient should give their name and this number, which they will have received by SMS (and in some cases email as well).

Bank deposit

Send a bank deposit instantly with WorldRemit

- **Create an account** if you don't have one (you will be asked for your address, email, phone number)
- **Enter your recipient's details** – choose from a list of people you've already sent to, or add a new person by entering their bank details and full name, phone number, address, and email (optional)
- **Pay.** Choose how you want to pay – bank account, debit/credit card, SOFORT, INTERAC, POLI or iDEAL (web) – then confirm the amount.

To find out how long the transaction will take, select the country you are sending to in the blue box on this page, then scroll down to 'bank deposits'.

Your recipient will be alerted by SMS and email when the money is available.

Airtime top-up

Top up airtime on your loved ones' phones instantly

Want to stay in touch with family and friends when you're far away from home? Then send an airtime top-up instantly with WorldRemit, so you can stay connected.

You can add more talk-time or data allowance to their mobile phones instantly. It's so easy, you can do it on your laptop or mobile. Airtime top-up is just one of four ways of sending with WorldRemit.

Here's how it works

- **Select country** you want to send to
- **Select airtime top-up** (sometimes called mobile recharge) as the service you want and select the provider
- **Enter the amount** you want to send

Then, you'll be directed to another page to:

- **Create an account** if you don't have one (you will be asked for your address, email, phone number)

- **Enter your recipient's details** – choose from a list of people you've already sent to, or add a new person by entering their details: full name, phone number, address and email (optional)
- **Pay.** Choose how you want to pay – bank account, debit/credit card, SOFORT, INTERAC, POLI or iDEAL (web) – then confirm the amount.

The airtime will appear instantly on your family, or friend's phone. Plus, you and your recipient will be alerted by SMS and email when the top-up is complete.

Please remember that airtime cannot be used as money to purchase other items or pay bills.
